

Mush Without Slush Dry Land Fun Race
April 7 – 8, 2018
Sponsored by the Pacific Sled Dog and Skijor Association

When: Sat/Sun April 7 - 8

Driver's meeting (both days): 7:30 AM

Where: Zimmerman Butte – Go northwest out of Sisters on Hwy 20 toward Santiam Pass just over 3 miles. As the passing lane ends, turn right onto Road 2059-500. Look for the race sign. Go back about 1 mile.

Entries: – Entries must be received by April 5th. No day of race entries. There are no entry fees but donations to PSDSA to cover event expenses are greatly appreciated.

Courses: We have several loops of varying distances. Each course will be run as a class. Within that, folks can run any of the team size and configurations listed for that class. Teams for each course will be on the trail together and awards will be presented to each category within the class.

Rigs must be dog-powered so quads will need to be run without motor assist. Helmets are required for participants under 16 years of age; encouraged for all participants.

Classes:

~ **2 mile course** – out and back with eye-loop

- 1-2 dog scooter & 1-2 dog bikejor
- 2-4 dog cart

~ **4 mile course** – loop trail

- 1-3 dog scooter & 1-3 dog bikejor
- 4 dog cart
- 6 dog cart

~ **6 mile course** – loop trail

- 1-3 dog scooter & 1-3 dog bikejor
- 6 dog cart
- 8 dog cart
- 10 dog cart

~ **9 mile course** – loop trail

- 2-4 dog scooter & 2-4 dog bikejor
- 6 dog cart
- 8 dog cart
- 10 dog cart

PSDSA Meeting: Will be held at the race site on Saturday after all teams in. All PSDSA members and non-members are welcome at the meeting.

The staging area is completely without amenities except for a porta-potty. It is ok to camp there but bring your own food, water and chairs.

Lodging is available at several motels on the west side of Sisters. There are also two campgrounds in the area. Indian Ford Campground is about 2 miles north of the race turnoff; small with pit toilet and running water. Cold Springs Campground is a few miles away to the west of the highway and has pit toilet and running water.
